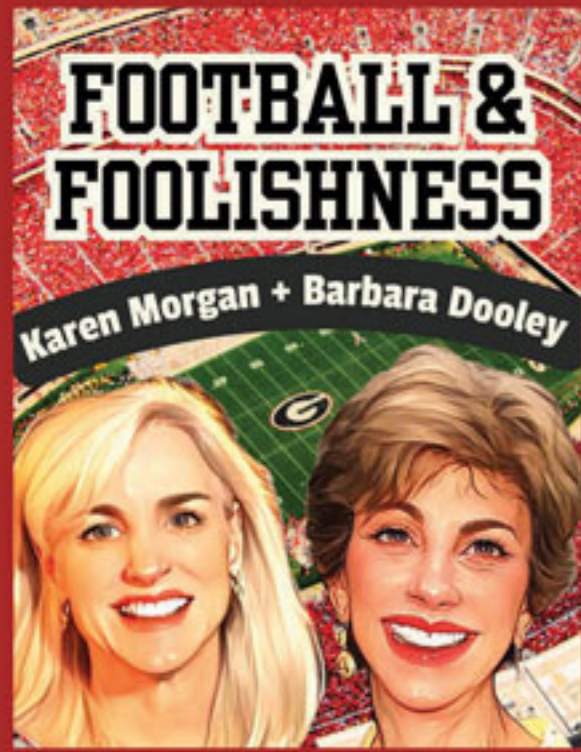

HARVEY

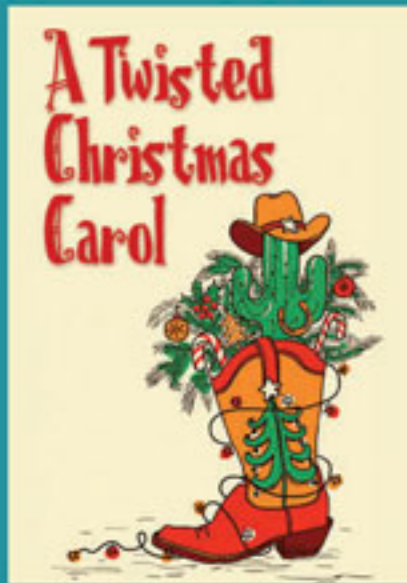

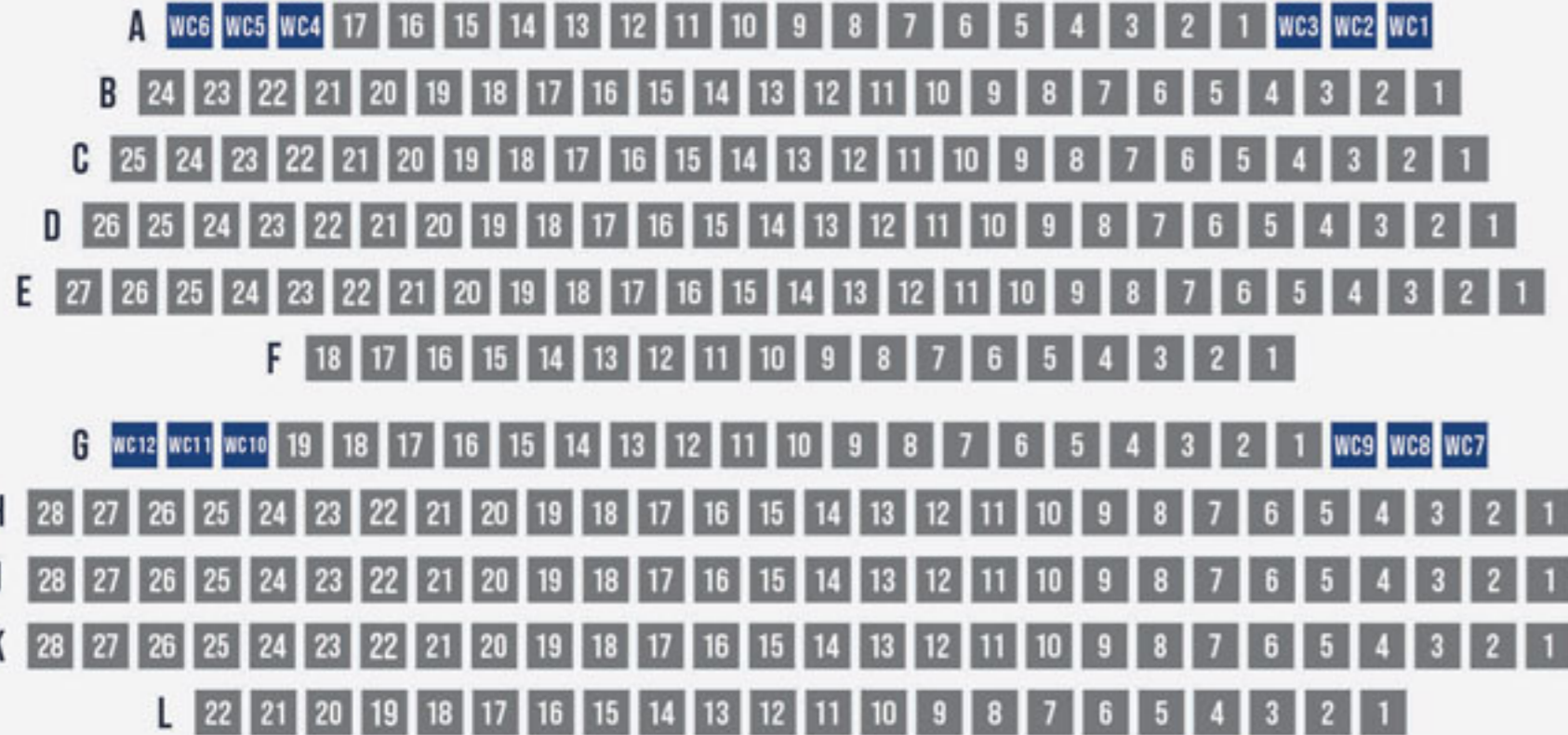


SUSAN HAYWARD TRIBUTE FILM: JACK LONDON
