
VISUAL ARTS

We have 14 visual art instructors.










VOLUNTEER OF THE


Participation Numbers




•According to the Americans for the Arts Economic Calculator, the Carrollton Center for the Arts had an estimated economic impact of \$2,606,980 during FY 23-24.
